WHO ARE WE?

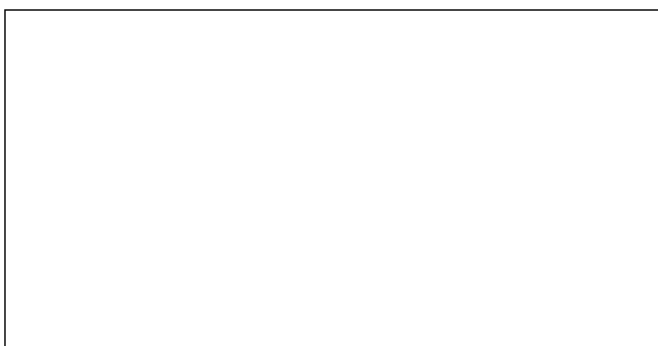

Ingham district

Within a 50km radius of the township of Ingham are coastal beaches and mangroves, freshwater swamps, dams and lagoons, creeks and rivers, melaleuca woodland, dry eucalypt woodland, wet sclerophyll and rainforest. Such diverse habitat attracts almost half of Australia's 700+ bird species, including many wet tropics endemics, within a relatively small area.

Key bird watching areas

Paluma Range National Park (with Jourama Falls), Abergowrie State Forest (including Broadwater State Forest Park), Lannercost State Forest, Girringun National Park (including Wallaman Falls), Hinchinbrook Island and Hinchinbrook Channel, Tyto Wetlands, Lucinda, Taylors and Forrest Beaches.
